
2018 Election Guide

In Missouri, our members turned back a corporate-funded attempt to make the State a Right-To-Work–For-Less. After the ballots were counted on August 7th, voters had defeated the anti-worker legislation by a 2 to 1 margin. I can't begin to thank each and every one of you that talked to your family, friends, and co-workers about this issue; your efforts are what made this outcome possible.

In Illinois, we have experienced four (4) years of the worst leadership in the nation as Governor Rauner has repeatedly tried to implement local "Right To Work" zones of his own throughout the State. We **SUPPORT** Proposition B

Raise the Wage ~ This implement a step process for raising the State's minimum wage. We believe it is important to help working families become less dependent on government assistance and be able to raise their standard of living.

We **SUPPORT** Proposition D

Fuel Tax ~ This modest increase will help fund the Missouri Stat Highway Patrol and also the State Road Fund which will employ many of our Sisters and Brothers in road construction.
